

The families of Wayne Hornquist, Lloyd Smith and Jason Podloski invite the community to take part in a Memorial Service next Sunday 12th November.

The location of the Memorial Service is at Fernie Secondary School on the east end of the soccer field around a bonfire. The service starts at 1:30pm. Seating and a live video feed will be set up in the Fernie Secondary School Gymnasium for anyone that does not want to be outside. Entrance into the gymnasium is through the west doors of the building. Please enter the area quietly from all sides of the service site. Dress warmly to be outside, there will be family parking only in the staff parking lot on the east side of the school. There is **no Mass** this week in Rocky Mountain Village but the Rosary will be prayed there on Monday at 2pm.

The ministers from the United Church, the Anglican Church and our Church are holding an evening of prayer and reflection for those affected by the deaths at the Rink. It will be from 7pm to 8pm this Tuesday at Know United Church, 201 2nd Avenue in Fernie (go in and up the stairs to the balcony). During the evening we will be praying for all those caught up in this tragedy, particularly Wayne, Lloyd and Jason's families. But we know that many more people have been affected by these deaths. Feel free to drop in at any time during the evening and to leave at any time. This evening is not a formal service but a quiet time for prayer, reflection and, if people want, a time to share either with one of the pastors or with others who are there. There will be some readings and music, but what we do will be adapted according to who turns up and what is right for them. So do come and join this vigil, even for a few minutes, so all affected by this tragedy know that the churches are holding them tightly in prayer.

The Holy Family Parish Restoration Committee is pleased to report that in the last few months we have received three grants towards our latest projects. One grant from Heritage BC for the development of a Conservation Plan for the Holy Family Church, one grant from Columbia Basin Trust and another from Heritage BC for the refurbishing of the stained glass windows, repair and refurbishing of the exterior trim on the church and refinishing of exterior doors on the church plus the fitting of electric door openers for wheelchair users and others with mobility issues. Work in these areas will commence this month and continue throughout 2018.

As a parish we are very grateful indeed to the Columbia Basin Trust and to Heritage BC for their kind support. Similarly we are very grateful to all the parishioners and our many visitors from Alberta who have (and we hope will continue) to support these projects.
