At both of our Palm Sunday Masses we will be reading the passion narrative from Matthew's gospel. This requires nine readers in addition to the priest (and whoever is reading the first and second readings at Mass). Some of these reading parts are very small and the text is available for readers to take home and practise. If you have never read in church this might be a good time to have a go. As you come in to

#### From Fr. David...

Continuation of a series of articles - Easter Saturday Night Service: Fernie – 5pm Holy Saturday In Fernie on Easter Saturday night at 5pm instead of a full Easter Vigil there will be a simplified Easter Night Service. This will include a couple of scripture readings but the main emphasis of the service will be on the symbols used: light and water, and of course on bread and wine.

With our new Easter or 'Paschal' Candle we will bring light into a dimmly lit church, this will show us that Christ is our light, a light that cannot even be extinguished by death.

Taking our Easter Candle we will use this symbol of Christ's presence in the world to bless the water of our font. This water will then be used as part of our renewal of our baptismal commitment.

With Christ's light shining on us and having been made new by the living waters of Baptism, we then



gather around the altar to celebrate the Eucharist. On the night before he died the disciples gathered around Christ with fear and confusion and Christ gave them the Eucharist to strengthen them and give them peace. On the day of the Resurrection at Emmaus the disciples again gathered around Christ for 'the braking of bread' and their hearts burned with joy listening to and be with their Lord. At the Eucharist on Easter Saturday night (and Easter Sunday morning) we focus on the joy of knowing the Risen Christ; we thank God the Father for his love shown so perfectly in Christ and we will simply rejoice in our faith.

While on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday we are asked to leave in silence and to find some stillness in our lives, on Easter Saturday night (and Easter Sunday morning) you are invited to leave the church rejoicing and go into our world ready to tell others of our joy in the risen Christ.

Sparwood is having a full Easter Vigil service at 8pm on Holy Saturday if you want to experience the church's full liturgy for Easter night.
