


21st/22nd August

Covid... is Still With Us

I am very conscious that Covid is still with us. As I am double vaccinated, it is not so much the potential danger of contracting Covid that worries me, but rather the issue of having to go into self-isolation. I fear that as things relax people are going to come close to me and talk to me without a mask, and then, if the next day they test positive for Covid, I might be asked to go into self-isolation for a period. Remember, you can have Covid and not have any symptoms.

I mentioned this to a few people and they said, "Oh no, that no longer applies if you are vaccinated", but the truth is that it does not *necessarily* apply, but in certain circumstances it can still apply. So, for example, as I write this my hay fever is playing up a bit, and this would be enough, along with a close covid contact, to put me in isolation, or at least, until it was determined that it was hay fever not Covid. One might be asked to self-isolate until one gets a negative result from a covid test, and that can take a couple of days.

My fear is that in the next few weeks we have two weddings, and of course, in any week I can have one or more funerals, not to mention the weekend Masses and a baptism or two. I would feel so dreadful if literally just before a wedding, a funeral or even the weekend Masses I was not sure if I would be allowed to preside.

So I say this to ask you to help me ensure I can do my ministry. Out of great kindness people say, "It's all right, you don't have to wear a mask when you come into this house." But if I *don't* take my mask off I hope you will understand that my aim is the wellbeing of those who are planning their wedding day, or those going through the stress of a funeral, or indeed the wider parish who looks forward to Mass on the weekend. Even if I had to self-isolate for just a day or two days until my status was determined, this could be enough to mean that someone else's 'big day' was put at risk. I hope this makes sense.

And Finally...

No one commented on my joke from last week, so obviously it appealed more to a British sense of humour than a Canadian one. Two people this week have asked me how old Thumper is, and I said, "One, which is just under two." and had to tell myself not to giggle because I would just look a bit weird laughing at something that wasn't funny.
