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Reflection – by Bishop Mark O'Toole

For the Lord desires so very deeply that they too find their home in Him.

May the Holy Spirt help us to encounter one another,

to listen deeply to one another,

to show us the direction the Spirit wants us to travel,

so that we can be more effective witnesses of Jesus to those who do not know Him.

Themes for Reflection

As we have done before, if you are doing this reflection with others, try to listen actively and without judgment. Do not enter into debate but rather search for what the Holy Spirit might be saying through the other person; pay attention not only to the words but also to the tone and feelings of the speaker; and listen actively to yourself, mindful of your own thoughts and feelings as you speak. Whether alone or with others, always pause before saying anything, asking that the Holy Spirit might guide you.

Dream Questions –

What is God's dream for me?

- 1. What is God's dream for me today, what does God want me to be?
- 2. What is God's dream for me for my whole life?
- 3. How can I help others to become what God calls them to be?

What is God's dream for our Parish?

- 4. What attribute or qualities does God most want our parish to reflect to the world?
- 5. How do we collectively build the Kingdom of God here in the Elk Valley?
- 6. What is God's dream for our Parish in twenty years time? And how do we move towards fulfilling that dream?

What is God's dream for the Church?

- 7. How can the universal Church journey together as one body?
- 8. How can the universal Church reflect the face of Christ to the world?
- 9. How can the universal Church fulfil God's dream for its future?

Closing Question –

In light of the last eighteen months living with Covid and your reflections on the four Advent themes, moving forward what are you most looking for,

from the Church? from the Diocese? from the Parish?
