#### Extra notes:

While our Christmas Eve Masses are usually well attended, our Christmas Day Masses often attract less people, so these will be a solemn but simple proclamation of the birth of Christ. Thus Christmas Eve will be a big celebration, and Christmas Day more quiet and reflective.

On Christmas Eve the sermon at all the Masses will be short, and we hope to have a number of Eucharistic minister's available so Communion can be distributed in a timely manor. So hopefully if we have visitors who only visit us once a year, these Masses shouldn't be too taxing!

*On Christmas morning*, we will be singing carols. There will be sheets available with carols on them, and if anyone wants a particular carol sung: Great – You lead off and we will follow!

*For New Year*, our weekend schedule will follow our normal weekend pattern.
