

# Saint of the Week



St. Joan of Arc was a 15<sup>th</sup> century French peasant airl who was given visions by God to drive the English out of the French lands and bring the Dauphin Reims for his crowning. As a young airl, she heard the voices of Sts. Michael, Catherine, and Margaret. Joan prophesied that the French would suffer a bad defeat at the Battle of Rouvray, and days later confirmation was received that indeed her prophesy was accurate, and it was believed that Joan was speaking to God. At Court, Joan spoke with Charles VII, who gave her approval to go into subsequent battles. The French won victory at each of the battles. Joan was eventually captured and sold to the English who wanted to execute her. Her trial was unjustly rigged and yet by God's grace she evaded their theological traps. When asked if she knew with certainty that she was in a state of sanctifying grace and she answered: If I am not, may God put me there; and if I am, may God so keep me. Despite the lack of evidence Joan was condemned to death and executed by burning on May 30, 1431.
