St. Veronica Giuliani was an Italian Capuchin nun and mystic who lived in the 1600s and early 1700s. Jesus gifted her with the stigmata and many visions. Veronica was born Orsola (or Ursula) Giuliani at Mercatello in the Duchy or Urbino on December 27th, 1660. She was the youngest of seven children, all daughters, three of whom became nuns. As early as three years old, she saved food from her meals and gave them to the poor and gave them some of her own clothes as well. Ursula's mother died when she was just seven years old. Gifted from an early age with devotion, Ursula was unrelenting when her family did not go along with all

her religious practices. She became obstinate was 16 and showed her that her "heart of family to adopt all the practices she was but Ursula wanted to enter religious life, and was 17 years old, she went to the Capuchin the religious name "Veronica" in honor of St. carried the Cross. Three years later He gave her the five wounds that He Himself suffered on the Cross. Her bishop treated her stigmata with great skepticism: he separated her from her community and had her watched closely for signs of deception. Ultimately, however, he realized that her stigmata were authentic, and she returned to normal life in the convent. St. Veronica Giuliani died on July 9, 1727, at Citta di Castello. After her death, the shape of a cross was found imprinted over her heart. When examined later, her body was found to be incorrupt.
