Pastor's Message

The discipleship is costly. To follow Jesus means to imitate His example in living and, if need be, suffering and dying because of faith in Jesus. Jesus, however, is not asking us to lead a miserable life of sacrifice and suffering to be good Christians but rather inviting us to a life of total love and freedom, to the extent of even forfeiting our precious life for the sake of love. It simply means to maintain a higher vision of life beyond meagre existence stirred by the law of pleasure and pain. Only unconditional faith in Christ can motivate one to live like Jesus 'setting his mind on things of God and not on things of man'(v.23).

What we consider as gain or loss affects the decisions and actions we make. And how we understand our life and seek to give it value influences what we consider as "saving" or "losing" our life. To follow Jesus faithfully, we must have the "mind of Christ" or be able to see life as he sees it. When we have the mind of Christ, the whole direction of our life changes; our whole concept of happiness changes. Then we can only see our lives in terms of loving and serving others and not in the pursuit of purely self-centred ambition.

The disciples are not just witnesses of Jesus' suffering but participants in it. They not only ought to tell about it, but 'bear the marks of the Lord Jesus' in their bodies (Gal. 6:17), which means to live through Jesus' suffering in their own daily life and work. In his book, Cruciform: Living the Cross-shaped Life, Jimmy Davis argues that 'the disciples of Jesus are called to embrace a cruciform life, in which the cross doesn't simply tell us that Christ has died, but teaches us how to live a cross-shaped life.

"To deny self and take up my cross daily" (Mt 16:24) means to walk the same 'way of the cross' that Jesus walked, namely, to lead a life shaped by the cross - living a vertical life of loving God and the horizontal life of loving people with one's whole self (head, heart, and hands). It is a call to see life from a 'longer' and 'larger' perspective. What will we profit, if we give our soul for the whole world? Not much. What will we profit, if we lose this our world for what is yet to come? Fr. Thomas
