# Pastor's Message: January 21, 2024

3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

For a fruitful participation of the Holy Mass, we need to understand the meaning of signs and symbols used in Mass. Holy Mass is one liturgy composed of two main components: the Liturgy of the Word and liturgy of the Eucharist. This can be subdivided into four parts: Introduction, Liturgy of the word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, and the concluding rites. Above all, there are several pieces and parts, as well as particular movements and moments, within the Holy Mass. The better you begin to understand the "order" of the Mass and its "flow", every mass will be able to nourish us with better Spiritual strength. For few weeks, I will try to explain them as I can.

In addition to the liturgy of the word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the Mass also has Introductory Rites at the beginning, which help us to enter into the solemn mysteries we are about to celebrate, and concluding Rites after Holy Communion, which send us out with the blessing of the Church to go out and serve the Lord and others by our lives (Extracts from "Alteration" page 79).

Introductory Rites: I had explained some of it before Advent. Now I am refreshing you all what we have learned.

1. Entrance Song and Procession: In every solemnity of Mass especially on Sundays, we make a solemn procession from the Entrance of the Church to the altar. Every procession is led by the Crucifix, Holy Bible

(adorned by two lighted candles carried by altar servers) carried by Lectors, Extraordinary Eucharistic ministers, and the Celebrant priest either from the entrance or from behind community. Just after two verses of the music, all of us move in a slow motion and stand in line in front of the Altar leaving the center place for the priest. Altar represents the sepulcher of the Lord. All together make a bow and disperse to different places. (When we do not process with the Bible, the candle bearers will be both sides of the crucifix).

2. **Participation** (by responding to the prayers of the priest and singing the music is very important) If God gave you a beautiful voice, sing with it. If God gave you a horrible voice, sing any way. Remember that singing at Mass lifts your voice, mind, and heart to your heavenly Father. St. Augustine said that when we sing, we pray twice. If you sing well or play an instrument, consider joining the choir or music ministry. Whether you sing or not, please respond to every prayer recited during the Mass.

3. Sign of the Cross: The celebrant makes the sign of the cross and greets everyone for the liturgical service with a small introduction inviting all to repent over the sins, with words; I confess or Lord, have mercy.

 Gloria: It is the sum total of peaceful greetings of angels proclaimed to the shepherds at the birth of Jesus at Bethlehem (Lk 2:14).

5. **The opening prayer** or Collect is the first prayer which is an invitation and conclusion of the introductory part of the Holy Mass. *Fr. Thomas Kakkaniyil.*
