Pastor's Message: January 28, 2024

4th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Friends,

The word of God comes after the introductory rites of Holy Mass. Normally we have three readings on solemn occasions with an additional psalm. Every lector needs to prepare and make sure of the readings. They need to read with sufficient pause and intonations. Since your voice reaches to ears of many, you need to pause at every clause and sentence.

Every reader needs to bow in front of the altar which is the sepulcher of the Lord. While going to read the word of God and coming back to the pew, they need to bow both times. As soon as the lector stands at the lectern, take few moments to settle down. After every reading, pause for three seconds and say, "The Word of the Lord". All will respond: Thanks be to God.

- Then the cantor sings the psalm, or the first lector recites the psalm.
- There after the second Lector come to the lectern and reads the second reading.
- When the priest stands up, the choir sings Gospel acclamation, Alleluia...


After the Gospel Acclamation, the celebrant will read the third reading, "The Gospel" and gives the Homily or breaks down the word of God. In normal cases, homily will cover just one or two points of importance from the scripture readings useful today in our lives. Every word of God has multiple meaning and importance in our lives. In a ten minutes homily one may be able to get an essential point of one's life.

After the homily, Priest will lead the community to recite the Creed. There are two creeds, the Nicene Creed as well as the apostles Creed. As soon as we recite "who was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary" all together bow our heads and make the sign of the cross.

As soon as we finish the Creed, the second lector comes to the lectern. Then the priest begins the prayers of the faithful and the lector will respond: "we pray to the Lord". After the prescribed petitions, the leader will say, let us pray for our own intentions. Here all of you can either offer their personal intentions, in silence or in audible words. If it is in audible words, the congregation will respond, we pray to the lord. After this the priest concludes the prayers of the Faithful. Then all sit for the offertory prayers. (Offertory will continue next week) For few weeks, I will try to explain them as I can.

1. Participation (by responding to the prayers of the priest and singing the music is very important) If God gave you a beautiful voice, sing with it. If God gave you a horrible voice, sing any way. If you sing well or play an instrument, consider joining the choir or music ministry. Whether you sing or not, please respond to every prayer recited during the Mass. That will help you to discard any distraction during Mass.

Pope Francis

Pope Francis announced the start of a Year of Prayer on Sunday in preparation for the Catholic Church's 2025 Jubilee Year.

In his Angelus address, the pope said that a Year of Prayer starting on Jan. 21 will be "a year dedicated to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer in one's personal life, in the life of the Church, and in the world."

"Dear brothers and sisters, the coming months will lead us to the opening of the Holy Door, with which we will begin the jubilee," Pope Francis said from the window of the Apostolic Palace.

"I ask you to intensify your prayer to prepare us to live this event of grace well and to experience the power of God's hope. That is why today we begin a Year of Prayer."
