### Passion (Palm) Sunday

Pastor's Message - April 13, 2025.

**On this Palm Sunday**, we celebrate the memories of the past glorious entry of Jesus



on Mount Olives and Jerusalem. The Apostles and the disciples of Jesus with a the crowd had a triumphal entrance

into the city of Jerusalem. He was welcomed like a king, the messiah of their expectation. As we proceed further with the holy week celebrations, we see gloom and sorrow on every face that followed Jesus.

The people who were there, were the people who loved Jesus, more than their own lives. The people who were there were people of faith, faith that God the Father would prevail even as His Goodness or the Son Jesus Christ was crucified. There were only a handful of people at the foot of the cross. How horrible the other disciples of the Lord must have felt when they realized that they did not have enough faith to stand beneath the cross with Mary, John and those few others. Where had they gone now, that He has left the city in a completely different type of triumph, the Triumph of the Cross?

### But life also has challenges and crises.

Life often calls us to good Friday sufferings and Calvary experience. That will call us to have faith in the Triumph of the Cross and sufferings. We may have sick people in our parish as our youngsters or elders. Family and friends pray for their loved ones uniting their pain to the pain of Jesus upon the cross. They are called to have faith in the Father, who is able to transform their grief into joy and death into life. If we have faith and trust in God, He will bring joy despite the present suffering.

The cross of the Lord, is a call to our faith in times of crises. Every crisis is a challenge to our lives and our faith. It takes tremendous courage and faith to hold on to Jesus when we are called to stand with Him on calvary,

when we are called to unite our pain and suffering to His sufferings.

When we consider the challenges that life throws at us, we realize that it is more important for us to be with the Lord on Calvary than with the crowd at their entry into Jerusalem. During this Holy Week, we ask God for faith, faith to hold on to Him when

we would rather be inclined to run and hide, faith to hold on to Him, when faith itself becomes difficult and demanding. We enter Holy Week now not just reflecting on events that happened just 2000 years ago, but still happening today all over the world, uniting our present to the past as well as His eternal presence in the future. May God bless you! +++ Amen. Fr. Thomas
