Fr. David writes...

Confessions this Tuesday at 7pm

I wonder if for most people, included, myself the Sacrament of Reconciliation is a bit of an enigma. By this I mean that for those of us who have been blessed with having had a really good experience of the grace and

peace that can come from bringing our brokenness to the sacrament, it is a delight; but at the same time we struggle to believe that these gifts are truly available exactly because of our brokenness, that it blinds us to God's unconditional love for us... or at least, that God's unconditional love will be communicated by the very human priest who is the minister of the sacrament.

Another fear might be that the cost of bringing our deepest hurts to God might be too great – simply, we don't want to go there. Or we might be telling ourselves that 'everything is okay' and we don't want to admit even to ourselves that in fact we could be a much more whole and peace-filled human being. Or we might simply feel too tired with everything we are already doing to think about growing!!!

In all these cases we are more comfortable with where we are than with the prospect of moving forward. Now hear what St. Paul said to the Christians in Rome:

For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly... God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. (Romans 5:6,8)

Or to put it another way, it was not when we were busy growing into full and rounded people that the Father sent Jesus to us, but when we had got stuck and were feeling unable to move forward. This is not only a historical fact but also a truth about the nature of God – God chooses to come to us exactly when we don't think we can do it on our own!

So you are warmly invited to come and celebrate a Mass of reconciliation on Tuesday at 7pm, and then after Mass priests will be available to hear confession. The priests will greet you with the love of Christ and at the end of confession give you the blessing of "pardon and peace". This might be the most valuable gift you will receive this Christmas.
