What Are You Doing for Lent?

If you haven't already decided what you might do for Lent, here are three simple suggestions that will take absolutely minimal extra time and not too much effort:

- If you are particularly attached to your seat at the back of church, why not give that up for Lent and decide to sit at the front? In this way you will not only be giving something up but also you might discover a richer involvement in the celebration of Mass, and you might also help improve the quality of our communal celebration.
- † If you are one of the people who leave Mass early that is, before the liturgy has ended and the procession has got to the back think about giving up this practise for Lent. Or even if you just leave before the procession has got to the back, ask yourself why you do this and wheth
 - procession has got to the back, ask yourself why you do this and whether you could, for Lent, wait for the final hymn of praise to God to end before you feel the need to get up and go.
- Decide to think about the responses we make at Mass; then during Lent try to make them your own. So often we can find ourselves making the responses mechanically. Let's stopping and think about them so they aren't just minimalist mumbles but true proclamations that give glory to God.

Another idea: Sacrament of Reconciliation – While I was away I got the chance to go to confession so I could start Lent positively. After the 7pm Ash Wednesday Mass we will be welcoming Joseph Gigliotti's body into church but after that I will happily stay on and hear confessions if anyone would like to start Lent in that way. We will be having a reconciliation service later in Lent with at least one visiting priest.
