

Pope's Intentions for June 2016

<u>UNIVERSAL</u>: <u>Human Solidarity</u>: That the aged, marginalized and those who have no one may find even within the huge cities of the world, opportunities for encounter and solidarity.

<u>EVANGELIZATION</u>: Seminarians and Novices: That seminarians and men and women entering religious life may have mentors who live the joy of the Gospel; and prepare them wisely for their mission.

Fr. David writes on Mass Stipends:

My starting point for this subject is that money and prayers should not be connected in any way. The history is that in the early years of the church priests would wander around the more remote areas and celebrate Mass with different families or groups. The group would then be responsible for covering the costs of the priest while he stayed with them. As priests then became settled in parishes with churches the idea was continued in the form of 'Mass Stipends' that meant the priest would still offer Mass for a family or group, but now in the parish church, and that family or group would cover that priest's living expenses for that day. Of course now the priest gets a salary so the parish covers his living costs.

For me Mass stipends feel like 'selling prayers' which is an abhorrent idea. So while I am very happy to pray for anyone's intention at any Mass, I don't think money should be involved. Thus if you would like someone to be remembered during Mass then please let me know before Mass and we can invite the whole assembled community to pray for that intention. Weekday Masses are obviously the best for this as these tend to be a bit more relaxed. It might be that more than one person comes forward and asks for an intention to be prayed for, and this too is fine – without money being involved the nice thing is that you don't have to exclude anyone's intentions.

If you want to discuss this I will be happy to explain my thinking further. We will also happily find a retired priest who would be willing to except Mass stipends and forward Mass requests to him. If you would like this done then please let us know. With thanks, Fr. David.

Working against suicide

The Government of Canada has introduced Bill C-14, An Act to amend the Criminal Code and to make related amendments to other Acts (medical assistance in dying). This proposed legislation, which responds to the decision of the Supreme Court of Canada in early 2015, will make euthanasia and assisted suicide legal and more accessible in our entire country. The Supreme Court decision and current legislative efforts are in stark contradiction to the endeavours of individuals, families and communities to counteract the dangers and sufferings of suicide.
