David... Reconciliation

Dates

We have the dates for our reconciliation service here in Fernie. It is Tuesday 4th April at 7pm. We will celebrate Mass and then we hope that one or possibly two visiting priests will be with us to hear confessions. If you can't make this date then Sparwood is having their reconciliation service on Monday 27th March at 7pm. If you can drive as far as Cranbrook, theirs is this coming Thursday, 16th March, at 7pm at Christ Our Saviour Church.

Service Times for Holy Week and Easter Weekend

The "Easter Triduum" consists of three services that the Church understands to be one service spread over three days. Thus at the end of the Maundy service there is no formal 'sending out', on Good Friday there is no formal welcome or conclusion, and on Easter night again the service starts very simply. During this time we will be asked to keep a certain 'stillness' in our lives.

The Maundy service is not significantly longer than a Sunday Mass; Good Friday is about the same length (depending upon the numbers who turn up); and for this year we will have a fairly simple Easter Saturday night celebration which again will not go on too long. And if you need another 'hook' to come – I don't preach at any of these services! Rather I try to get the liturgy to tell its own message. The service times in Fernie will be:

Maundy Thursday - 7pm - 13th April Good Friday - 3pm - 14th April Holy Saturday - 5pm - 15th April Easter Sunday - 9am - 16th April

Over the next three weeks in the newsletter I will say a few words about each of the Holy Week services. First: the Maundy service.

Maundy Service: Fernie – 7pm Thursday of Holy Week

Maundy means 'commandment' so on this day we fulfil Christ's commandment to love one another and symbolise it with the washing of feet. At this service the washing of feet is offered to anyone who would like. This is not a re-enactment of Christ

washing his twelve disciples feet; rather it is the

fulfilment of the commandment that Christ gave us, "After he had washed their feet... he said to them, "I have set you an example, that you also should do as I have done to you." (John 13:12-15)

At every Mass we process forward in a

prayerful way to receive Communion; we started Lent by processing forward to receive the Ashes of Ash Wednesday; on Good Friday we will process forward to venerate "the wood of the cross". Similarly on Maundy Thursday you will be invited to process forward in a prayerful way to have your feet washed.

Women are building an inclusive society in Indonesia

This week, Development and Peace – Caritas Canada is taking you to Indonesia to meet Risya, a 22-year-old Indonesian woman who has been blind since adolescence. In collaboration with its partners, Development and Peace provided emergency relief, completed the construction of 3,500 permanent homes and related infrastructure, and helped establish 26 community organizations.
