# Welcome!

We extend a particularly special welcome to anyone who is joining us for our 'Homecoming' weekend.

I have a family member who, every so often, will refer back

to what a particular bishop said at a school assembly over forty years ago. This upset him and, I think, has coloured his view of the whole Church since then. This is so sad, yet in a way I am no different. When I was a teenager I had first a Honda motorbike then a Yamaha. The Honda always started and functioned perfectly; the Yamaha never started and was always back at the garage for this or that to be repaired. Then forty years later I was buying a small generator and there was a Honda and a Yamaha – and you know which one I chose, don't you – yes, the Honda. This says to me that memories linger on, even after many decades!

Of course the difference is that a motorbike is just an

inanimate object; a bishop is someone with authority, someone who is expected to show us the face of Christ, someone who we want to trust. So perhaps I should be a bit more understanding of my family member.

If a bishop, a priest or a Catholic parishioner has said something to you that has upset you, I am sorry. If it would help to tell me about it I would happily listen.

The whole purpose of this 'Homecoming' weekend is to try to live out the Pope's vision of a Church which centres itself on mercy. So we do welcome in love all those who are joining us this weekend.
