Nine Lessons and Carols – Sunday 18th December at the Anglican Church

If you don't know about the Nine Lessons and Carols service, it is a wonderful old tradition that we share particularly with our Anglican neighbours but also with many other Christian churches. Basically it is a selection of scripture readings and carols that tell the Christmas story. During the service one is taken first through the Old Testament and then through the Gospels telling how Christ came to be born into our world. These nine readings are then placed between nine traditional carols that illustrate and rejoice in the same story.

The Anglican parish next door to us will be holding this service on Sunday 18th December at 3:30pm and a potluck supper to follow the service. All are welcome. There will be a mass choir practice on Wednesday the 14th of December at 5:00 pm at Christ Church. All are welcome. They are doing this service with us and with the United Church in town. This means that they have asked us to provide three readers for three of the nine lessons. The United Church will also provide three readers as will the Anglican Church. This should be a lovely service that we jointly provide both for ourselves and for all people in Fernie as a way to prepare for Christmas. If you could help with reading then please call Rev. Fr. David writes...

A note about Advent – At Mass I try to mark Advent as a different time from the rest of the year. Normally at Masses during 'ordinary time' I tend to always use the same 'memorial acclamation':

We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again. Then during the seasons I try to change it to one of the other two acclamations. So during Advent we will

other two acclamations. So during Advent we will switch to the second acclamation:

When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your death, O Lord, until you come again.

This one of the ways that we will mark out Advent as a different, other ways are that the altar will have purple coverings and the penitential rite at the beginning of Mass will be of the form 'Lord have mercy. Christ have mercy. Lord have mercy.'

Decorations – Advent is not Christmas, rather it is a time of *preparation for* Christmas. To this end we should try to keep it as a time *before* the celebration and we should try not to pre-empt Christmas. One way of doing this is to start decorating your house this weekend and over the next four weeks slowly build up the

decorations until they reach their fullness at Christmas. You could also get the figures of your crib and put them around your house – or at least, around the room where the crib is placed. This will make the crib more a living representation of the Christmas story.
