#### **Special collection for Haiti Relief** – *Next Weekend*

As you will know Haiti was struck by cyclone Matthew at the beginning of October. This had a massive effect on the country. dead and 128 are missing according to official authorities, but other sources indicate a death toll of more than 1,000. Overall about three million people were affected:

- o 175,000 have been displaced and are living in temporary shelters;
- o 1.4 million people require humanitarian assistance;
- o 806,000 face severe food insecurity;
- o 1,412 new cases of cholera have been reported;
- o 200,000 houses have been destroyed or serious damaged.

Very particularly in this diocese we are being asked to celebrate a "Homecoming" weekend when we invite Catholics who do not usually come to church to return and join us on the weekend of 19<sup>th</sup>/20<sup>th</sup> November which is the Feast of Christ The King.

So what we are asking you to do firstly is to think who you might want to invite; most obviously might be family members, friends or neighbours, but you might also think about work colleagues, fellow Mums or Dads at the kindergarten, or whoever. Next weekend we will provide you with an invitation you can give out to invite these Catholics back; it will have the date and times of our "Homecoming Weekend" Masses written on it. The prayer we will pray says, "We desire to reach out to all of them as you have reached out to us – with mercy." So let us pray that we will be a welcoming community and people will return.

# **Vatican Instruction about Cremations**

You might have heard something about this in the press this week. After consulting with our Bishop I produced the attached comments on this subject, I hope they are helpful. They just highlight why the Vatican raised the issue and some of the principles behind the Vatican's teaching in this area.

#### Second Reading at Sunday Mass

For the next three weeks our second reading on Sunday's will be taken from the second letter of St. Paul to the Thessalonians. The city of Thessalonica (modern day Thessaloniki) was and is a major city in this region of Turkey. It is believed that at some point after St. Paul had written his first letter to the Thessalonians some of them grew concerned about whether those who had died before Christ's second coming would share in His victory. St. Paul's second letter to this community was a response to these concerns.

As you might imagine in this newly formed church community in Thessalonica there were those who tried to take the community in different directions and taught things contrary to what St. Paul had taught. While St. Paul gives stern orders not to go along with them, he adds in 3:15, "Do not regard them as enemies, but warn them as believers." or in other translations, "...but warn them as brothers".

In two weeks' time we will hear in this letter St. Paul saying, "we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat." In 1917 Lenin, the first leader of the Soviet Union, described this as a "socialist principle". Such as shame that Lenin didn't read on a few verses and make 'regard your enemies as brothers' also a principle; perhaps this is a reminder of the danger of 'cherry picking' verses from scripture.

#### **Standing and Sitting**

If you didn't see the item last week about when we stand and sit at Mass there are copies at the back of the church. Basically it said that the rubrics ask us to be seated as the offertory gifts are brought forward, so there is no need to stand at this point.
