From the Parish...

News From Fr. David

I have had another full week, but I did get a whole day off when I went hiking in the Welsh hills - even if it was cool and cloudy.

Exactly thirty-three years ago this week I entered seminary (the college for priestly training) at St. John's College, Wonersh, England; but more importantly, this month also marks 125 years since this seminary in southern England first opened. To mark this anniversary there are many events - some of which I am trying to be part of. Sadly the most important event I couldn't fit in to my time away; it was a trip to Rome. This was the first time a whole Seminary from England had gone together on pilgrimage to Rome. The trip included an audience with the Holy Father, Pope Francis. The seminarians and staff sat together just a few feet away from the Pope as he delivered his message that, Jesus' "call to conversion was expressed not in judgment but in closeness to sinners and mercy to those in need." He reminded the group of "our own need of forgiveness and interior conversion. As an experience of unmerited love", he said, "true conversion always entails openness to others, especially the poor." **Mass Times**

One of the most moving moments of the pilgrimage occurred when the

whole seminary, carrying a cross of mercy and singing, processed half a mile up the Via del Conciliazione, through St Peter's Square and down the centre aisle of the Basilica to the tomb of St Peter. Apparently the strong male voices stopped hundreds of tourists and reminded them that St. Peter's is a place to glorify God. The group then spent a week on retreat in Italy before returning to England this week where there are a number of other events that will mark the anniversary.

So we do pray for St. John's Seminary in particular, but also generally for all those who are in formation for the priesthood and for those who give their life helping them on their journey.

This weekend I will also be presiding at my Godson's wedding, so we pray too for Jack & Emma and for all those getting married around this time.

Readings - Some Thoughts from Fr. David

The gospel reading is Luke's well known parable of the "Prodigal Son" - or is that, "The Father with two sons"? Many retreat givers have spent a whole week opening up the layers of this rich gospel so it is hard to know what to say about this profound reading. In my prayer space I have a big copy of Rembrandt's painting 'The Return of the Prodigal Son', a painting that inspired the great spiritual writer Henri Nouwen. He wrote in his book "The Return of the Prodigal Son: A Story of Homecoming":

"Rembrandt is as much the elder son of the parable as he is the younger. When, during the last years of his life, he painted both sons in *Return of the Prodigal Son*, he had lived a life in which neither the lostness of the

younger son nor the lostness of the elder son was alien to him. Both needed healing and forgiveness. Both needed to come home. Both needed the embrace of a forgiving father. But from the story itself, as well as from Rembrandt's painting, it is clear that the hardest conversion to go through is the conversion of the one who stayed home."

We should also note that over the next seven Sunday's we will be reading from St. Paul's letters to Timothy. These are not the easiest of St. Paul's letters, but I will quote one verse from 2 Tim2:20, "In a large house there are utensils not only of gold and silver but also of wood and clay, some for special use..." In the priesthood I so often feel that I am not the golden priest or the silver priest, but the wooden one or the clay priest, but even then the Lord can still use me. For all of us in the Church, we will not all be gold or silver, but the Lord has put us in the "large house" for a reason and he still wishes to use us. So gold or wood, silver or clay, let us remember that we are God's chosen utensils that He will use to serve out his love.
