Catechism Classes Start this Wednesday

Our catechism classes start up again this week. These classes are a time when our youngsters can find out about Jesus and the love he has brought into the world. And this knowledge is given expression through prayer and given a structure through having the faith of the Church explained to them. 'Catechism Classes' are so much more than learning the Catechism! So if your kid is in grade 1 through 7 (age 6 to 13) then please do register them for the classes. Classes run on Wednesdays from 3:45pm to 4:45pm. The first class will be a special Mass for the kids. At this Mass the youngsters will gather just as the disciples did for this most special meal. Parents are also encouraged to attend, and indeed it is open to any parishioners. Adults attending are asked to set a positive example to the children by gathering around the altar and getting involved with the ministries of the Mass like setting up, reading, serving, clearing away and, not least, making the responses in a joyous and meaningful way. Remember, faith is caught more than taught.

Catechism registration is \$40 for one child, \$60 for two children and \$75 for three or more children and this is just to cover materials. We are very

grateful to all our teachers who are volunteers and give of their time out of love of the kids and of our faith.

Appeal for New Readers and

New Eucharistic Ministers

Over the last two weeks we have attached to the newsletter sheets that explain the need we have for more people to volunteer to read at church and more people to become Eucharistic ministers. If you didn't see either of these sheets, copies are available on the table in the entrance way.

Perhaps we need to stress again how few people we have doing ministries in Fernie. In terms of Mass attendance Sparwood is only about 60% the size of Fernie yet has getting on for twice as many on their volunteers list. Indeed tiny little Elkford probably has nearly as many readers and Eucharistic ministers as Fernie. In Fernie we struggle to get people actively involved at our Masses. So please do see these sheets and think about volunteering.

Generally speaking, we would only have to lose one or two of the key parishioners who do so much of the work, then our Sunday Masses would literally grind to a halt.

So please reflect on the following: Hopefully no one would go home to their parents house for a big and important family meal and just sit down without offering to help in some way? Yet this is exactly what many do when they go to their Heavenly Father's 'house' for the most special meal of all – the Eucharist. **We must all play our part**.
