
From the Diocese and Beyond...

Chautauqua and Fall Fair...



The Chautauqua and Fall Fair is being hosted from Thursday, 8th to Sunday 11th September. This fair recreates two events that were once held in Fernie. The Chautauqua, a popular travelling cultural festival, was held each June in Fernie from 1917 to 1935. The Fernie Fall Fair was a staple of the Fernie event calendar from the late 1910s to the 1960s.

The Holy Family Parish will be participating in one of the events during this four-day festival. On Saturday 10th Holy Family Parish will be opening the doors of our church to the public from 11am to 4pm. Volunteers are needed to act as hosts and tour guides to welcome both locals and tourists to our church and to provide them with a short 10 to 15 minute informal tour that provides information about the history of Holy Family. The organizers of the Chautauqua and Fall Fair also invite members of the Holy Family Parish to "Viva Italia, Viva Fernie: A Celebration of Fernie's Italian Heritage". A home-cooked spaghetti dinner hosted by Fernie's Italian community kicks off the 2016 Fernie Chautauqua and Fall Fair at the Fernie Family Centre on Thursday at 6pm to 9pm. Special guest, author Lynne Bowen, will share stories about Fernie's early Italian community from her book, 'Whoever Gives Us Bread: The Story of Italians in British Columbia'. Entertainment by Rosanne Anselmo, Mike Bruschetta and John Palone. Tickets are \$15 a person and are available from the Fernie Museum; no tickets will be sold at the door. Proceeds support the Fernie Museum's Community Memory Project.

Syrian Refugee Committee Update

A small but consistent core of dedicated volunteers have filled all executive positions on the committee and are holding regular monthly meetings. Our September meeting will be held at the Catholic Hall at 6:30pm on September15th everyone is welcome to attend.

Total funds raised to date is \$8520.00. We have established firm contact with Nelson Diocese who are the Sponsoring Agency and they have been very supportive of our efforts. The Federal Government rules have changed since we started, process is now much more lengthy, It will require patience, prayer, and persistence on our part.

We have been encouraged by our Sponsorship Holder to consider a larger family because there aren't many smaller families available. As a committee we have decided to accept a family of 6, with up to 4 children and 2 parents. With a need to be flexible we will be accepting a family of any background or religion approved by Federal Gov't. Our plan is to make a commitment in next few months, but the approval and administration processes may delay arrival of our family for 18 - 24 months

The upcoming Fall Chautauqua Event will be a great opportunity to fundraise for the project. We encourage everyone to come out to the events we are sponsoring and to bring your friends and neighbors to enjoy some local authors, beverages and homemade pie on Friday evening between 3pm to 10pm and the Pancake Breakfast on Saturday 8:30am to 10:30am on the street next to the Fernie Museum.

It is our hope that we can expand our network of refuge supporters within and outside our Catholic Church in the month ahead and welcome questions and quires about the process. We have secured commitments for medical and dental support for the incoming Fernie refuge family, have a storage unit available to accept household items and prospects for housing as well.

The atrocities and violence in Syria continues to displace more people, thousands are still held hostage in their own villages, and thousands more are warehoused temporarily in tents in the desert.

your support and participation is still needed in order to meet the fund-raising and volunteer support levels required for Fernie to, once again, demonstrate its long-standing tradition of welcoming immigrants to our beautiful community.
